Faith to Heal

As we come to the close of this year (and this decade) in the midst of our Christmas celebrations, we invite you to reflect and give thanks with us for all the Lord has done and continues to do at Refuge. This year we want to share the testimony of one of our clients. She asked for a chance to share her heart with you by writing a letter of thanks to all the supporters of this ministry.

The stories our clients share are sacred. This story is just one of them. We will call her Morena.

Morena was assaulted in the street last December, exactly one year ago. At random—she was beaten, bloodied, hurt, and humiliated in broad daylight on a busy sidewalk. Not one person intervened. She describes the hurt of being left alone to suffer as this happened as being more painful than the physical agony.

What she felt was not just the physical hurt of one random, unfortunate accident. It became part of the story of all her pain—her race, her language, her skin color. The experience changed her life completely. What she describes is trauma. In time, her pain became fear. As she went out, now fear overwhelmed her daily.

This is her testimony. "It is hard to live with fear all the time," she says. She Executive Director (Interim) went first to Esperanza Health Center. "I knew esperanza means hope, and it was here I got my first glimpse of it." It was as she was being treated for her wounds and being ministered to at Esperanza that she was referred to Refuge.

> "At Refuge, my healing first started when I found someone willing to listen, someone who could understand this fear. There was warmth in the way I was welcomed—my language, my skin, even with no insurance, the doors were open to me." Here with us she was not alone, and the story of her life changed.

> She is thankful to God for the people working here. She says, "You don't even know how much God can transform lives in this place. People must know the magnitude of what they are supporting. I haven't just recovered my life. This help has recovered the life of my whole family."

> She was able to overcome severe trauma at REFUGE and by God's grace, her life and her family's life was transformed. A place that welcomed her faith, where truth was spoken and brought into the light as she healed—this most of all she wanted to acknowledge in gratitude to everyone who has made this possible.


> "It has been every blessing to know people from God who have walked alongside me as a woman of faith—knowing that I am not alone en la calle."

> Morena is a living testimony of how supporting a place like Refuge—it is a way of intervening in the hurt we see. When we give by faith, we never know what God will do with it—but sometimes we do get a glimpse of it now and then.
